Iris sibirica—Siberian Iris

Beautiful blooms in June. 'Caesar's Brother' is an old, award-winning variety and remains in great demand because of its deep coloring and exceptional vigor.

Growing Requirements—Full or part sun.

Planting—2'-4' tall, 18"-24" wide. Grows best in slightly acidic soil. Grows in clumps.

Care—Prefers moist soil.

Pests/Disease—More disease resistant than bearded iris. No serious diseases.

Dividing/Propagating— divide in spring if necessary.

Louisiana Iris – 'Black Gamecock'

A black-blue flower with deep green foliage. Flowers are good for cutting. **Parts of plant are poisonous if ingested. Handling plant may cause skin irritation or allergic reaction.**

Growing Requirements—full sun, somewhat dry to wet soil.

Planting—3' tall, 18-24". Fast grower. Spreads by rhizome.

Care—suitable for bogs and water gardens; can thrive in drier conditions.

Pests/Disease—disease resistant.

Dividing/Propagating—divide every 2-5 years in summer.
